

"Oh no!" cried the dog. "My beautiful, tasty bone!" and he began to cry.



Shar Peis	These dogs come from China. They are unusual, because they have a blue tongue.



One of the easiest ways to find out the breed of a dog is by looking at the shape of the face. Some dogs have very pointed faces, but others are more rounded. Another way to identify a breed of dog is by looking at the ears. Some dogs have pointed ears that stick up, but others have ears that droop down.

If you are choosing a dog for a pet, it is a good idea to visit a dog show, so you can see lots of dogs and talk to their owners.


Dogs will eat both meat and vegetables. There are lots of different dog foods that you can buy in the shops, markets and pet stores.
